Creation to Satsang

At the very beginning of time, *Parmatma* was there, and there was nothing else. He created everything. He made the first man and woman and they were his special creation. He had a perfect relationship with them – he walked with them, talked with them, and took care of them – until one day the man and woman disobeyed *Parmatma* and broke their relationship with him. This disobedience separated them from *Parmatma*.

The descendants of the man and woman filled the earth. But, just like the first man and woman, their disobedience separated them from *Parmatma*. However, *Parmatma* never forgot his special creation. One day, he spoke to a man named *Abraham*, and he told *Abraham*, "I am going to give you many descendants. I am going to make a huge nation out of them. They will be the people I have chosen for my purposes. I will offer the whole world the way to a restored relationship with me through these descendants of yours." And, even though *Abraham* and his wife had never been able to have children, *Abraham* trusted in *Parmatma's* promise. Because of this, Parmatma restored his relationship with *Abraham*.

Parmatma kept his promise to Abraham. He made a great people out of Abraham's descendants. Sometimes they trusted Parmatma and his promises, like their ancestor Abraham, but most of the time they were disobedient, just like the first man and woman. So, Parmatma sent special messengers to the people to show them how they could have a good relationship with him again. One of Parmatma's messengers was named Isaiah. Isaiah brought Abraham's descendants a message of hope about a Promised Muktidata. He said, "We have all gone away from Parmatma and his ways. We all disobey. But Parmatma says, 'I am sending you the Muktidata, who will take all of the punishment for your disobedience on himself. He will be whipped and beaten. He will

die because of your defiance toward *Parmatma*. But, I will give him life again. And, because of what the *Muktidata* will do, you can have a restored relationship with me."

From that time on, they waited expectantly for this Promised *Muktidata*, and they waited....

Parmatma did keep his promise to Abraham's descendants. He sent the Promised Muktidata. This was Sanatan Sadguru Yeshu, Parmatma's very own Son. Lord Yeshu proved that he was indeed the Muktidata by performing many miracles and by healing people.

Not everyone recognized who *Yeshuji* was, but many people did follow him as the unique *Sanatan Guru*. He taught his disciples. One day he told them, "**If you follow me, I** will give you *amrit jivan*. You belong to me. No one can take you away from me. *Parmatma* and I are one."

Those who did not put their trust in *Lord Yeshu* became very angry that he had claimed that he and *Parmatma* one. So, they convinced the government to have him executed. And, just as *Parmatma* had said, *Yeshuji* was whipped. He was beaten. And then he was brutally put to death. But, as *Parmatma* had also predicted, *Lord Yeshu* was given life again!

Afterward, the *Sanatan Guru* showed himself to his followers, and he clearly proved that he had come back from the dead. For forty days, *Lord Yeshu* taught his followers. He told them, "I will leave you soon, but when I do, I will send you the *Divya Aatma* of

Parmatma. When you accept his Divya Aatma, you will receive power - power to tell everyone about me. Go into all the world and tell people about me. Tell them to obey all the things I have taught you. When they put their whole faith in me, then give them my deeksha and make them my bhaktas through jal-sanskaar. Teach them that through this deeksha that they have surrendered their whole life to me. It will mean that they have been released from paap and through faith in me have turned to Parmatma."

Right as he was saying these things, *Yeshu* ascended into the sky. When the *shishyas* were looking up into the sky they saw two *ish-doot* coming down. The *ish-doot* asked them, "Why are you looking up into the sky? **The** *Sanatan Guru Yeshu* **will one day return in the same way you saw him go.**"

From that moment on, the followers of *Lord Yeshu* waited expectantly for him to return. And they went everywhere telling people about him. And when people believed in *Yeshuji*, they were immersed in water, symbolizing their *deeksha* as his disciples. This ceremony demonstrated that they had turned from their disobedience to a restored relationship with *Parmatma* through faith in *Sanatan Guru Yeshu*.

This is what true followers of *Yeshuji* do even today. They tell everyone about him. They meet together to worship *Parmatma*, pray, take care of one another's needs and learn more about their *Sanatan Guru, Yeshuji*.

And this is something that I do as his shishya. I tell others about Lord Yeshu!

Creation

At the beginning of time there was nothing. There was only *Parmatma*. And *Parmatma* decided to create the world. He said "Let there be light", and there was light. He created the sky and He made water and dry land. He made the sun, the moon and the stars in the sky. Then he made plants grow on the ground, fish to swim in the sea and birds to fly in the sky.

Then He created a man out of the dust of the earth and he placed him inside a beautiful garden so he could live in it and take care of it.

A river ran through this garden and kept it watered. And in the middle of the garden there were two trees – one tree was the tree of life (when people ate its fruit they lived forever) and the other tree was the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. *Parmatma* said to him, "You can eat the fruit of any tree in this garden except for the one that gives the knowledge of good and evil. You can't eat the fruit of that tree. If you eat it you will surely die."

Then *Parmatma* saw that it wasn't good for the man to live alone. So he put the man into a deep sleep and removed a rib from his body from which he created a woman. Then *Parmatma* brought the woman to the man. *Parmatma* said, "Be fruitful and fill the earth."

Then *Parmatma* saw all that He had made was very good. *Parmatma* created the earth in six days and on the seventh day he rested. And *Parmatma* met with the man and the woman and spent time with them.

Creation of the Spirit World and the Arrival of Sin

Before creating the world *Parmatma* made the *ish-dut*. He gave them power and authority and they lived in param-*swarg*. *Parmatma* had made them for his worship and praise. But among all the *ish-dut* that *Parmatma* made one was more beautiful than them all. And he became very proud. He thought to himself, "I will become like *Parmatma*." and he rebelled against *Parmatma*. He took one third of all the *ish-dut* in *ish-lok* with him. Because of this *Parmatma* sent them out of *ish-lok*. All the *ish-dut* who rebelled against *Parmatma* are called *dusht-aatmae*. And the name of the one who led those *dusht-aatmae* is *shaitaan*.

Of all the animals that *Parmatma* created on the earth the snake was the most cunning. *shaitaan* came into the snake. The snake came to the woman and asked, "Is it true that *Parmatma* has forbidden you to eat the fruit of every tree in the garden?" The woman answered, "No that is not true. He only said that we can't eat the fruit of the tree that gives the knowledge of good and evil. If we eat it we will surely die." The snake said, "No that is not true. If you eat it you will become like *Parmatma*. That is why He dosen't want you to eat it." So the woman looked at the tree and saw that its fruit could give knowledge. She took the fruit and ate it and then gave it to her husband. As soon as they ate the fruit they received knowledge, they became ashamed and the way they saw things was totally changed. They realized they weren't wearing any clothes so they tore off the leaves of trees and wore them as clothing.

When the time for *Parmatma* to meet them arrived He came into the garden and called out to them and asked, "Where are you?" Then the man replied, "We are afraid! We are hiding because we are ashamed that we are naked." Then *Parmatma* asked, "Who told you that you were naked? Did you eat the fruit of the tree that I told you not to?" Then the man said, "This woman who you gave to me, she gave me the fruit to eat." So

Parmatma said to the woman, "What did you do?" And the woman said, "No, it was this snake who came and tricked me. That is why I ate the fruit."

So *Parmatma* said to the snake, "You will be cursed above all the other animals because of this sin and you will wriggle on your stomach and your face will be in the dust. Your descendants will always be enemies of the woman's descendants. You will bite his heel and he will crush your head.

Then He said to the woman, "What you have done is wrong and because of this you will suffer greatly during your childbearing."

Then he said to the man, "You did not obey me and because of this the ground will be cursed for you. You will grow food for yourself from the ground. And the ground will become hard and you will grow food by your sweat and labor.

Then *Parmatma* thought to himself, "Now that the people of the earth know everything, both good and evil. What will happen if the also eat the fruit of the tree of life and live forever?" So *Parmatma* sent them away from the garden and blocked the entrance.

Abraham

The first man and woman's disobedience separated them from *Parmatma*. However, *Parmatma* did not forget about his special creation. *Parmatma* wanted to restore his relationship with humans. Many years passed. Then *Parmatma* chose one man through whom he would make a new people that would be his own. This is the *katha* of Father Abraham.

Parmatma said to Abraham, "Leave your birthplace and the place of your relatives and go to the land that I will show you. I will make your descendants into a great nation and I will bless you and make you famous. You will be a blessing to many people. All the families of the earth will be blessed through you." Just as Parmatma commanded him, Abraham left. Abraham was 75 years old when he left his birth place. He took his wife Sarah, his wealth, all of his animals, and his entire household and went out toward the land that Parmatma would show him. When they arrived, Abraham went through the land and when he stopped in one place he set up his tent next to a huge tree. Then Parmatma appeared to Abraham and said, "I will give this land to your descendants." Abraham worshipped Parmatma who showed himself.

After some time, *Parmatma* spoke to Abraham in a vision and said, "Do not be afraid...I will protect you and you will receive a great reward." But Abraham replied, "*Parmatma*, what is the purpose of your blessing when I don't have a son of my own. Because you did not give me a child, a servant in my household will be the heir of all my property. You didn't give me my own offspring, so my servant will be my heir."

Then *Parmatma* said to him, "No your servant will not be your heir, because your own son will be your heir. Then *Parmatma* took Abraham outside of the tent under the sky and said to Abraham, "Look at the sky. Count all the stars if you can. Your descendants will be as many as the stars!

Abraham believed *Parmatma* and for this reason *Parmatma* was pleased and reestablished relationship with him.

King David

Parmatma fulfilled his promise to Abraham. He made his descendants into a great nation. Parmatma raised up many leaders for his people. Out of those leaders was one named David. This is the *katha* that tells us how he became a king.

One day *Parmatma* said to his *ish-pravakta* Samuel, "Go to Bethlehem. Go to the person I will show you because I have chosen one of his sons to become king. When he arrived there, the *ish-pravakta* saw the first son and thought, "Surely *Parmatma* wants to make him king." But *Parmatma* said to him, "I have rejected him. I do not make decisions the way you do. People judge by outward appearance, but *Parmatma* looks at a man's heart and motives."

All of the seven sons came before the *ish-pravakta*. But the *ish-pravakta* said, "*Parmatma* has not chosen any one of them." Then he asked, "Are these all of your sons?" The father answered, "There is also the youngest son, but he is in the fields tending the sheep." When that son was brought before him, *Parmatma* said to the *ish-pravakta*, "This is the one I have chosen." Then David stood up amidst his brothers and the *ish-pravakta* anointed his head with oil and *Parmatma's* Spirit came on him.

Several years passed and David became the new king. *Parmatma* brought peace to his kingdom.

One day *Parmatma* sent another one of his *ish-pravaktas*, Nathan, to tell David that, "When you were only a shepherd I chose you to show these people the way. Now I will make you famous on this earth. And I will start a royal line from you. From your line, one will rule – but if he does evil and commits *adharm* I will use other nations to punish him. But my love is unending and your kingdom will be forever."

When David heard this message he praised *Parmatma* and believed *Parmatma* saying, "Parmatma fulfill your promise because you are my *Ishwar* and your word is true."

David and Bathsheba

One time during the spring when kings go out to war, David sent out his entire army to battle, but he stayed back in the palace. One evening David was walking on his roof and when he was looking down at his colony, he saw a very beautiful woman bathing. He sent his servant to find out who she was and he told David, "Her name is Bathsheba and she is the wife of one of your faithful soldiers." Then David sent his servant to call her. When she came into the palace he slept with her. Then she went to home. After some time, Bathsheba found out she was pregnant so she sent a message to David and there was no doubt that the child was his.

Then David gave the order for his commander to send Bathsheba's husband home. When he came, David asked him, "How is the battle going?" After that David told him to go home and rest. But he didn't go home. He stayed the whole night at the entrance of the palace with the king's servants. When David heard what he had done, he asked him, "After living far from your home for so many days, you still didn't go home last night?" He answered, "While our army is sleeping in the fields, how could I go home and rest?" Then David asked him to stay another night and invited him to dinner. And he gave him alcohol to drink and made him drunk. Still he was not able to send the soldier home to his wife Bathsheba. That night again he slept at the door of the palace.

The next day David wrote a letter for Bathsheba's husband to deliver to the commander. In the letter was this message, "When the battle becomes dangerous, put this soldier

forward and have everyone else withdraw so that he will be killed." The commander did just that. And Bathsheba's husband was killed with many other soldiers.

After that the commander sent a message about the battle to David and said, "Bathsheba's husband was killed along with many other soldiers." Then David said, "Do not be discouraged commander, people get killed in war. Next time we need to fight harder."

When Bathsheba heard the news of her husband's death she cried and mourned. After some time King David made her his wife and brought her to the palace. Then she gave birth to a son. But *Parmatma* was grieved by what David had done.

Nathan's Story

Because *Parmatma* was grieved by David's actions, *Parmatma* sent his *ish-pravakta* Nathan to David and he told David this story:

"There were two men in a certain town, one that was rich and owned many sheep. The second man, who was poor, had only one lamb which he took care of and raised like his own child. One day a guest came to the rich man's house. He didn't kill one of his own sheep, but he took the poor man's lamb and killed it and served it to his guest."

David became furious with anger and said, "Whoever did this should be punished with death. He should return at least four sheep to that poor man."

Then Nathan said to David, "That man is you! *Prabhu* said, 'I anointed you king. I gave you this whole kingdom. And if this wasn't enough I would give you even more. So why did you go against my command and do such a terrible thing! You killed a man and took his wife. Because you sinned against *Parmatma* from this time on there will be violence in your family. What you have done in secret will be brought into the open.

Then David accepted his mistake and repented. "I have sinned against *Parmatma*." Nathan said, "Yes; *Parmatma* has forgiven you and he will not kill you, but because of what you have done your son will die."

After that, Nathan went home. Bathsheba's child became very sick. David pleaded with *Parmatma* but after seven days the child died.

David comforted Bathsheba and after some time she became pregnant again and gave birth to a son and *Parmatma* loved him.

Promise

After Father Abraham, all of his descendants who became kings did not follow *Parmatma's* commands but instead followed man. *Parmatma* allowed the neighboring countries to invade in order to punish them for their disobedience. Abraham's descendants were scattered but *Parmatma* did not forget his people. To give a message of hope, he sent an *ish-pravakta* named Isaiah. "Because of this, many people will be able to have a restored relationship with *Parmatma* again."

Isaiah gave this message to the people and since that time people are waiting with great hope for the fulfillment of the promised coming of the *Muktidata*.

The Birth of Muktidata Yeshu

Parmatma sent one of his *ish-doots* to a virgin named Mary. He said to her, "Joy and victory to you. I have brought you a good message." Upon seeing him, Mary became afraid. The *ish-doot* said to her, "Do not fear! You will conceive and you will give birth to a son and you will name him *Yeshu."* Then Mary said, "How is this possible? I am still a virgin." Then the angel said to her, "*Parmatma's* Spirit will overshadow you and you will become pregnant." Then Mary said, "I am the servant of *Prabhu*. In that city lived a king. Some wise scholars come to visit him from a faraway country. They said to him, "Has the foretold birth of the *Muktidata* happened already? Hearing this, the king became upset and called all of his astrologers and asked them, "Has the birth of the king happened already?" The astrologers confirmed this issue to the king. Then the King went out to the scholars and said, "You go and see the *Muktidata* and then tell us also so that we can go and see him."

In search for the *Muktidata*, the scholars followed behind his star until it stopped in one place. They saw that *Yeshuji* was there. After some time passes, the king dies. After that, *Yeshuji's* father has another dream. In it the *ish-doot* said to him, "The one who wanted to have this child killed has died. Now get up and take the child and his mother to another country." He did just that.

Yeshuji's Jal Sanskaar (Guru Deeksha)

In the time of *Guru Yeshu*, *Parmatma* sent one of his *ish-pravaktas* ahead of *Guru Yeshu* to prepare the way for him so that people would know the promised *Muktidata* and accept *Sadguru* Yeshu. After some time, *Parmatma's* message came to a man named John the *Deeksha Guru* who lived out in the jungle.

Some of the religious *gurus* were saying amidst the crowd, "*Guru ji* stop your *bhaktas* from saying all these things."

He replied, "If they were quiet the rocks along this path would shout out."

As soon as *Prabhu Yeshu* came close to Jerusalem he looked at the city and started to cry and said, "If only you all could understand the way of peace but now it is very late. Peace is hidden from you and your enemies will destroy you because you did not recognize the time of the coming of *Parmatma*."

After that he taught in the place of worship daily but the Religious *gurus* started to make a plan to kill him. However, they were not able to do anything because all the people believed every word he said.

Great Grace – The Last Meal

Sadguru Yeshu and his close shishyas arrived in Jerusalem. Many people were in that city because it was the festival time.

Then Judas, one of *Prabhu Yeshu's shishyas*, went to the religious *gurus* to decide how to have *Prabhu Yeshu* arrested. For this the religious *gurus* promised to give Judas a reward. So Judas was in search of an opportunity to quietly arrest him when there was no crowd around. *Guru Yeshu* and his twelve *shishyas*, among whom was Judas, sat together to celebrate the festival and have a meal together. *Prabhu Yeshu* said, "It was my deep desire to have this meal together before I suffer."

Sadguru Yeshu knew that Parmatma had given him authority over all things. So he stood up, took off his coat and tied a towel around his waist and filled a basin with water. He started to wash his *shishyas'* feet and then wiped them with the towel that was around his waist.

After washing their feet, he put on his coat and sat down with them. Then *Prabhu Yeshu* asked the *shishyas*, "Do you understand what I did? You call me *guru* and *swami* and you are correct because this is true. Because I, as your *swami* and *guru*, have washed your feet, so you also should wash each other's feet. I have shown you an example that you should do just as I have done for you. It is true that a servant is not greater than the *swami*. These things that you know, now you must do.

Prabhu Yeshu took roti and gave thanks to Parmatma for it and then gave it to his shishyas to eat. He said, "This roti represents my body which has been given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." After the meal he took the cup and said, "This juice is the sign of the new covenant from Parmatma, which you will be saved through the pouring out of blood.

After that he sang a song of worship and then went out to a mountain outside of the city.

Arrest and Trial

When *Prabhu Yeshu* was with his closest *shishyas* he said, "While I go ahead to pray you all sit here."

After some time when he came back to his *shishyas* he said, "Look, the time has come. The one who will arrest me is here."

Judas, one of his *shishyas*, came with a crowd of people carrying swords and sticks. They grabbed *Prabhu Yeshu* and arrested him. All of his closest *shishyas* leaving him ran away.

They took *Guru Yeshu* to the chief religious *guru's* house where many scholars and religious *gurus* were gathered. They were seeking someone to give testimony against *Guru Yeshu* so that they could give him the punishment of death. Then the chief religious *guru* stood up and asked *Prabhu Yeshu*, 'Do you not have anything to say to clear your name?" But *Prabhu Yeshu* did not give an answer. The chief *guru* said to *Prabhu Yeshu* again, "I ask you in the name of the living *Parmatma*, are you the

promised *Muktidata*, the son of *Parmatma?" Prabhu Yeshu* replied, "Yes, just as you have said." Then the chief *guru* tore his clothes and shouted, "Now what is our need for a testimony? You all heard that he profaned *Parmatma*. Then he spit on *Prabhu Yeshu's* face and beat him with his fist."

In the morning, the religious *gurus* discussed together how they could get the government to give him the punishment of death. They bound him and took him to the governor.

Now *Prabhu Yeshu* stood before the governor. The governor asked him, "Are you the king of these people?" *Prabhu Yeshu* answered, "Yes. It is as you have said." However, when the religious *gurus* spoke against him, *Prabhu Yeshu* remained silent. The governor asked, "Do you not hear all the accusations they are bringing against you?" But *Prabhu Yeshu* gave no answer and the governor was amazed.

Then the governor called the religious leaders and all the people. He told his decision that, "You brought this man here and you accuse him of rebellion. I have examined him and found no guilt in him. He has done nothing deserving of the punishment of death. For this reason I will have him whipped and release him. Then the crowd yelled out, "Kill him!" The governor explained to them because he wanted to let *Prabhu Yeshu* go. But the crowd began to shout, "Kill him!"

The governor saw that there was no solution and the outcry was increasing. So taking some water he washed his hands and said to the crowd, "I am innocent of this man's

death, the guilt will be one you." The people replied, "The responsibility for his death will be on us and our descendants."

Then the governor had *Prabhu Yeshu* whipped and he delivered him into the soldiers' hands to give him the punishment of death.

Great Sacrifice

Yeshuj and two criminals were taken to a place called the skull to be put to death. They nailed his hands and his feet to a cross. Both criminals were also with *Prabhu Yeshu* on crosses on his left and on his right.

The crowd was watching and a soldier was mocking him saying, "He saved others, if he is the *Muktidata* sent by *Parmatma* then let him save himself!"

One of the criminals who was with him on a cross said to *Yeshu*, "So you are the *Muktidata* sent by *Parmatma*? If so, then prove it by saving yourself and save us also!"

But the other criminal rebuked him saying, "Do you not fear *Parmatma*? You are receiving the same punishment and we are being justly punished but He has done nothing wrong." Then he said to Him, "*Yeshu ji*, when you go into your kingdom remember me."

Then *Prabhu Yeshu* answered him saying, "I assure you that this very day you will be with me in paradise."

By that time, it was afternoon. But there was a darkness spread across the whole country and it was covered in darkness until three o'clock. The light of the sun was covered and *Prabhu Yeshu* yelled in a loud voice, "*Pita Parmatma*, I submit my spirit into your hands." And saying this He died.

There was a good religious *Guru* there who wasn't in agreement with the other *Gurus*. He went to the governor and asked for permission to take away the body of *Prabhu Yeshu*. Then he took the body off the cross, wrapped it in burial cloth and put it in a new tomb.

All this happened on a Friday. When they were taking *Prabhu Yeshu's* body some women came who were his *Shishyas*. They went along and saw the tomb in which His body was placed. The entry door was covered with a large stone. Then they returned home.

Great Victory Over Death

After *Prabhu Yeshu's* death, early Sunday morning the women went to *Prabhu Yeshu's* tomb to apply ointments to the body according to their custom. They saw that the stone at the entrance had been removed so they went inside but didn't find *Prabhu Yeshu's* body. Two men in bright clothing appeared.

Seeing this, the women became afraid. The man said, "Why are you searching for a living man here? He is not here. He has risen from the dead. Do you remember what he had said; that he would be arrested and would die, but he would rise three days later?"

After some time, when the *shishyas* were gathered together and were discussing this, suddenly *Prabhu Yeshu* appeared there. He said, "Peace to you." Everyone became afraid and started to think that they were seeing a ghost. He said, "Why do you doubt me? Look at my hands. Look at my feet. Touch me and know that I am not a ghost." They still could not believe, but they were filled with joy and amazement. Then he asked them, "Do you have anything to eat?" They gave him food and he ate it.

Then *Prabhu Yeshu* told them in great detail that this was all for the fulfillment of *Pramatma's* plan; that he suffer, die and on the third day rise from the dead.

For forty days *Prabhu Yeshu* taught his *bhaktas*. He said to them, "I will leave you soon, but when I do, I will send you the *Divya Aatma* of *Parmatma*. When you accept his *Divya Aatma*, you will receive power - power to tell everyone about me. Go into all the world and tell people about me. Tell them to obey all the things I have taught you. The *shishyas* of *Prabhu* who were staying in Jerusalem were waiting expectantly for the coming of His *Divya Aatma*.

Seven weeks after the resurrection of *Prabhu Yeshu* His shishyas gathered together in a certain place to celebrate an important festival.
